- You need help carrying a suitcase.
- You are looking for the nearest ATM.



### Activity 5 – One-Minute Speaking

Talk for one minute about one topic.

- A time someone helped me.                      A funny time I got lost.
- The nicest stranger I have met.                      A time I helped someone.
- Why helping people is important.

### Activity 1

Offer to help.

Someone asks for help, but you don't know the answer.  
Respond politely.
