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Mini Overview

A fun beginner lesson about barbecues, food, drinks, people and outdoor activities. Students use the pictures to practise simple vocabulary and sentences before finding differences between the two scenes.

Level: A1 - Suggested time: 45–60 minutes

1. Warm-Up: What Do You Like?

Teacher-student discussion.

- Do you like barbecues?
- Do you like meat?
- Do you like vegetables?
- What do you like to drink?
- Do you eat outside?

Answer: Yes, I do. / No, I don't.
