2. The Question Rule: Do vs. Does

To ask a Present Simple question, put **Do** or **Does** at the beginning:

Do / Does + Subject + Base Verb ...?

- Use **DO** with → I, You, We, They ("Do you like pizza?")
- Use **DOES** with → He, She, It ("Does she work on Saturdays?")

⚠ **Teacher Note:** When you use **Does**, the main verb stays in the base form!

- ✓ "Does he like tea?" ✗ "Does he likes tea?"

REAL ENGLISH BOX – Friendly Short Answers

- Don't just answer with a plain "Yes" or "No"! Use short answers to sound polite: "Yes, I do," "No, I don't," "Yes, he does," or "No, they don't."
