REAL ENGLISH BOX

When giving directions, “**go**” + **direction** is very common:

“Go straight ahead.”

“Go along Main Street.”

“Go past the bank.”

“Go to the end of the street.”

Then give the next action:

“Then turn left.”

“Then cross the street.”

This makes directions much easier to follow.
