- This is Maria's bag.
- This is the dog's ball.

Rules (Keep it simple)

• Singular noun

→ add 's

Tom → Tom's

the girl → the girl's

• Plural noun ending in -s

→ add only '

the boys → the boys'

my parents → my parents'

• Irregular plural

→ add 's

the children → the children's

the men → the men's

the women → the women's
