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1. Sentence Order: Making Questions

To make questions with the verb *be*, put **Am / Is / Are** at the start of the sentence!

- **Statement:** You are hungry. → Question: **Are you** hungry?
- **Statement:** She is from Brazil. → Question: **Is she** from Brazil?
