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1. Auxiliary vs. Verb "Be" Inversion

Remember: Questions with the verb **Be** (*am, is, are, was, were*) do **NOT** use *Do/Does/Did*! Simply swap the subject and verb:

- Statement: *You are tired.* → Question: **Are you** tired?
- Statement: *He was late.* → Question: **Was he** late?

2. Teacher's Error Clinic

- "Does he LIKE ice cream?" (remove 's' from main verb)
- "Did you GO to the store yesterday?" (use base verb 'go', not past 'went')
- "Are you a student?" (don't use 'Do' with the verb 'Be')
- "Can you drive a car?" (remove 'to' after modal verb 'Can')
